Welcome to the Choir Program at American Fork High School! AFHS Choirs have a strong tradition of performing excellence. Participation in choir will be challenging and rewarding as you strive to become a competent and confident choral musician through rehearsal and performance of a wide variety of choral literature from around the world and throughout history. To do this we will focus on six disciplines:

- 1. Musicianship** (reading, writing, understanding, and performing music)
 - 2. Healthy Vocal Production** (science and physiology of healthy singing)
 - 3. Text Meaning and Diction** (pronunciation, IPA, figures and parts of speech)
 - 4. Repertoire** (exposure to quality literature and performing groups)
 - 5. Individual Responsibility** (calendaring, planning, meeting expectations and commitments)
 - 6. Collaboration** (building group unity while maintaining individual accountability)

Learning outcomes: At the end of this course students should be able to:

1. Produce a beautiful tone
2. Demonstrate productive rehearsal habits
3. Demonstrate notational literacy
4. Demonstrate technical vocal/choral performance skills
5. Evaluate ensemble performances
6. Demonstrate both sight-singing and basic ear training interval/chord recognition skills

Assessments and Grading

STUDENTS WILL HAVE TESTS, QUIZZES, AND ASSIGNMENTS IN CANVAS AND ON OTHER ONLINE PLATFORMS. STUDENTS MUST HAVE ACCESS TO TABLETS, PHONES, OR COMPUTERS WITH A MICROPHONE AND INTERNET CONNECTION TO SUCCEED IN THIS CLASS.

Rehearsal Grade – 35%: Productive and attentive participation in choir rehearsals and

- Do not miss rehearsal unless you are contagious to others. Students who miss class for prolonged periods of time due to illness or quarantine should practice the choir music 30 minutes per absence as they are able. Listening to the part predominant recordings counts as practice when singing is not possible.
- Students with more than 4 absences prior to a concert may not sing in the concert unless he/she passes off the music to a section leader or the teacher.
- Full participation includes having music and marking it in pencil.
- Students using cellphones, iPods, headphones, eating and/or doing homework during rehearsal without direct permission from the teacher will lose rehearsal points.

Concert/Festival Performances – 30%: These performances are MANDATORY. Dates are on listed on the last page.

- Any performance or festival conflicts must be discussed and cleared with the teacher at least TWO WEEKS prior to the event. Conflicts with work, other rehearsals, sport practices, church activities, etc. are not acceptable reasons to miss a concert. “I forgot” is not a valid excuse and no makeup points will be permitted. Students ill or under quarantine will receive an alternative assignment.
- Students ineligible for performances due to attendance issues and/or lack preparation or who must make up a missed a performance for an excused reason may earn up to 80 % of the points for the concert by attending or viewing two choral concerts and completing a concert report form available from the teacher.

Assignments – 5%: Formative assessments for students to practice music theory, vocal, or ear training concepts.

- Students must have access to the Internet to complete assignments using Canvas, Sight Reading Factory, Charms and/or the choir website. A computer for student use is found in the choir room. Students will have a weekly practice log to complete in Canvas due every Friday.

Quizzes – 10%: Formative assessments on music theory, vocal, or ear training concepts.

- Students must have access to the Internet to complete quizzes using Canvas, Sight Reading Factory, Charms and/or the choir website.

Tests – 20%: Multiple online summative assessments will be given each term.



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Choir Uniforms

- Choir uniforms are different this year. Since live concerts are as yet unknown, we will be wearing a choir shirt and jeans for performances. Should festivals be permitted, we request that choir students wear concert black.
- A Singer's Resonance Mask in black is being purchased for each student. These masks allow for the needed movement of the jaw for singing and will permit us to safely sing in rehearsals with a reduced field of aerosol spray to help those who are at risk for serious COVID-19 complications. Students are responsible to launder and bring masks to school for use during choir rehearsals. Until the Resonance Masks arrive, students should wear his/her own mask during rehearsals.
- The fee for these items is \$40 per student. This money should be paid to the Finance Office by September 4, 2020

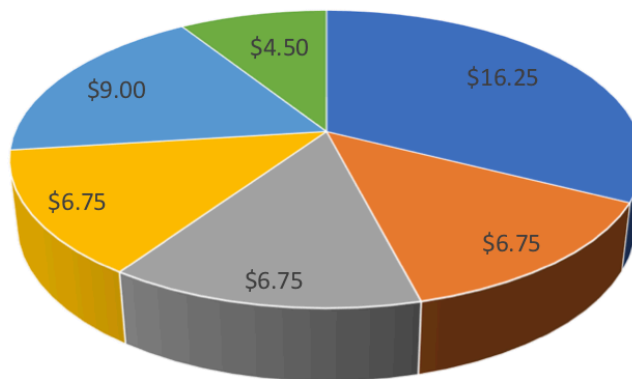
Choir Tour

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Classroom Expectations in the COVID-19 Era

Classroom rules, procedures, and rehearsal etiquette are strictly enforced and failure to follow the rules will result in lost participation or removal from the class for chronic offenders. Mrs. Warby and her family are at HIGH RISK of complications from COVID-19. Please be mindful of those who are at high risk and follow these **bolded** guidelines. If you are uncomfortable singing in choir rehearsals at the high school, please consider taking the Vocal Techniques class offered as an online option. The choral experience cannot be replicated in an all online setting. Choirs by nature require in person interaction. Online students are also welcome to take AP Music Theory.

- **Unless there is a doctor's prescribed medical reason not to do so, wear a mask.**
- **Students are to be in his/her ASSIGNED seat to assist with contact tracing. No two students will use the same seat in the auditorium during the day to better protect students from SARS-CoV-2.**
- **Bring your own water bottle as the drinking fountains are not the safest alternatives at this time.**
- **DO NOT PLAY THE PIANO OR PASS THE RED TAPE LINE AROUND THE PIANO. This is to keep Mrs. Warby healthy. Accompanists will be permitted to use the piano after Mrs. Warby has sanitized it for student use. Playing the piano as you enter or leave class is no longer an option. For classes held in the auditorium, students should not enter or get on the stage. They must stay in the house seats.**
- **Music will be provided, but should put it in your own binder with a pencil to bring to class. Students without access to a binder or pencil should let Mrs. Warby know and she will provide them. In order to keep contamination to minimum will not be using shared choir folders and pencils this year.**
- **Bring as little as possible to class. Just your music, a pencil, water bottle and a pocketed cellphone are needed regularly. Items brought to class MUST fit under your chair.**
- **When (if) FLEX happens, students are to work quietly in their assigned seat unless given direct permission from the teacher to move elsewhere. Social distancing should be maintained in FLEX.**
- **All assignments and forms should be turned in online through Canvas or to the mailbox outside the choir room. Be sure that if you turn things into the mailbox that your name and class period are marked on your assignments or forms.**
- Show respect to Mrs. Warby/student conductors and to each other by not talking when the director is speaking or when any section is singing.
- Be kind and patient with the director and each other.
- Students will be required to sing solos OR in small groups. No exceptions. Students unwilling to do so should take another class.
- Students should have music, paper, and pencil prior to the starting bell or he/she will be marked tardy.
- You are to remain in the class the entire period unless given permission by the teacher to leave. Bathroom breaks should be no more than 5 minutes. **To aid in social distancing, only one student may use the restroom at a time.**
- No food, drinks (except water), or gum is permitted during class without prior approval from the teacher.
- Use of cellphones, iPods, electronic devices of any kind, headphones, etc. without permission is not permitted.

Early Assignments (All due by August 21, 2020)

These assignments are due the first few weeks of first term or within two weeks of a student joining any of the AFHS choir classes.

- ***Disclosure Document Assignment*** is found in Canvas and is due August 21, 2020.
- ***Remind*** is an app that allows Mrs. Warby to send out free texts to students and parents and also allows students to respond as needed without having to give out her personal cell phone number to students. All members of choir with texting capabilities should join Remind so that we can more easily communicate about assignments, call times, concerts, festivals, etc. Parents are welcome to sign up Instructions for are found on the choir website homepage (www.afchoir.org). This should be done by August 21, 2020.
- ***One Thing*** Students should complete this online survey in Canvas to receive points for the assignment. This should be completed by August 21, 2020.



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Choir Concert/Rehearsal Dates for the 2020-2021 School Year

At least two weeks' notice will be given for such events.

Modifications made to the calendar due to the pandemic will be sent out via Skyward email.

If audiences cannot safely attend concerts due to the COVID-19 pandemic, concerts will be streamed for families on a password protected site.
